Overview of the project

Morrison Construction were appointed for the phased upgrade of classroom areas within the High School, which is a grade B listed building. The art deco school was opened in 1937 and has undergone many extensions in subsequent decades. Due to this segmented approach the building was in need of a revamp and modernisation. As work progressed, intrusive surveys revealed a number of significant structural defects within the listed building and the scope of the project was increased to address this.

Through Phase 1 of this project, the Highland Council received 14 classrooms along with offices and a brand new state of the art biomass energy centre. Morrison Construction provided the Highland Council with a high degree of confidence in their ability to deliver the work within the challenging environment of a "live" school. Through their work Morrison Construction developed a close relationship with the staff and pupils and have taken part in sponsored walks, attended career evenings and donated school football strips.



Project Benefits

Inverness High School has benefitted significantly by the vastly improved facilities provided through the classroom upgrade programme. Having a trusted contractor on-site, appointed through SPA, has allowed the additional works to be incorporated seamlessly into their works. This has led to significant time and cost benefits around procurement and programme.

Morrison Construction has been appointed to carry out further works for Phase 2 of this refurbishment project to improve the condition and suitability of the whole building with an anticipated completion in 2021.
